

Telepathic Interspecies Communication A Mixed Methods Study with Domestic Canines

Introduction

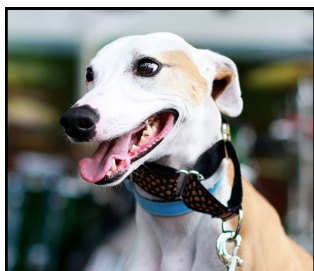
This research explored the proposition that telepathic interspecies communication may be possible by utilizing contemplative/meditative techniques to quiet the mind. This process to shift cognition into a pattern similar to the hypnagogic and hypnopompic states on the edge of sleep may allow for a consciousness alteration that enables telepathy.

Fifty animal communication sessions were conducted with canine guardians in 36 cities. Recorded telephone sessions consisted of standardized questions and the guardian's questions. The canine answers, allegedly received telepathically, were shared with the guardian and documented on an online survey. The guardians rated the accuracy of quantitative questions and the overall accuracy for the session from 1 (entirely inaccurate) to 6 (entirely accurate). The qualitative data were analyzed by determining common canine behavioral issues as identified by the guardian's questions.

Methods

Design

Five standard questions were asked of all animals, remainder of session was open to guardian's questions. All session data transferred to online feedback form which guardian completed. Standard questions were rated by guardian for accuracy as well as overall accuracy for entire session.



Participants

Originally planned for 20 sessions, researcher received overwhelming response to recruiting email, expanded to 50 sessions; 88 people turned down. 35 canine breeds or mixed breeds were represented.

Guardians must have signed consent, have email, send photos of canine, agree to completing feedback form. Canines must have been at least 1 year old and have been with guardian at least 1 year. All telephone conference call sessions recorded. All guardians completed feedback form; 100% participation.

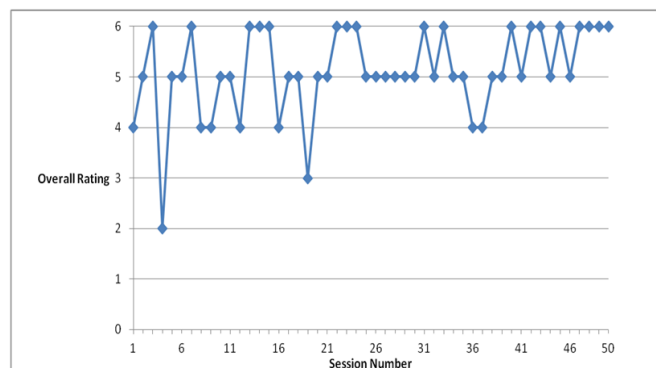
Instruments

Recruiting email sent by researcher, forwarding was encouraged. Research consent form, online feedback completed by guardian. Three of five standard questions had quantitative ratings and overall session rating. Guardian questions had qualitative comments from guardians.

Results

Overall Accuracy Ratings

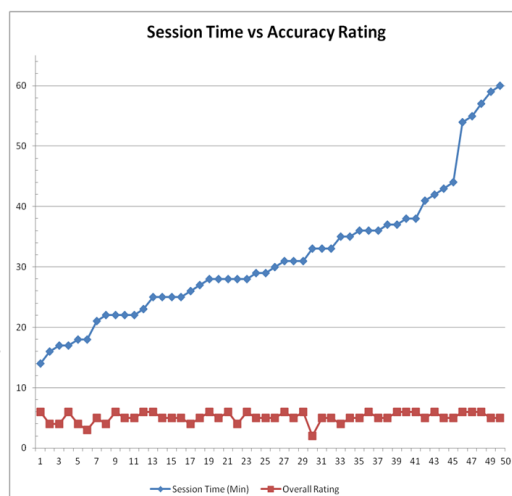
Overall accuracy rating across all 50 sessions was 5.12. 48 sessions (96%) were rated by the guardian as a 4 (moderately accurate) to 6 (entirely accurate) and more than a third of the sessions (41, or 82%) received a rating of 5 or 6. Accuracy appears to have increased as more sessions were conducted. After session #19, the remaining 31 sessions (62%) were all rated as 4 or above, and 29 sessions (58%) were rated as 5 or above.



Session Time Vs Accuracy Rating

The bulk of the sessions were 21 to 40 minutes in length (35 sessions, or 70%).

Shorter length sessions (14 to 20 minutes) resulted in only a very small (0.65) difference in accuracy ratings as compared to longer length sessions (21 minutes or more). Longer length sessions did result in slightly higher ratings as the session length extended.



Discussion



Common Issues

- Canines reactive to other canines in public.
- Canines reactive to strangers entering their home or in public.
- Conflicts between canines in a multi-dog household.
- Affection between canines in a multi-dog household.
- Physical health issues.
- Emotional and spiritual support issues.

Limitations

No blinding; researcher was animal communicator. Possible participant bias. Researcher could have received information telepathically from guardian versus canine.

Suggestions for future research

Blinded design. Research with other species. Other meditative and breathing techniques utilized to quiet the mind.



Conclusions

Telepathic connection could be enabled by energetic love connection between guardian and canine. The parapsychology research world should look closely at possibilities for future intuition and telepathic research with animals; animals simply have less noise in their heads. Animals are completely telepathic; humans have to learn to quiet our minds to hear them. It is in the dark, quiet, internal space that animals can be heard.

The human ability to acquire information intuitively does not decrease with distance. Intuition is not limited by the ordinary causal relations of time. Electromagnetism cannot be the carrier wave for intuitive information. Intuition appears to be more highly developed skill in some people and can vary over time. The researcher believes anyone can learn animal communication by learning to quiet the mind, expand intuitive skills, create a sacred space, and open the heart chakra energy to the interconnectedness of all sentient beings.
